At NMSU, she served as chapter president of the National Political Science Honor Society (Pi Sigma Alpha), helping to organize a student panel on reproductive rights at a national conference in Washington, D.C. Jillian's accolades include the Nick Franklin Public Policy Scholarship and the college's Community Engagement for Social Justice award.
