While studying at NMSU, she gravitated toward ruminant (hoofed animals with multiple stomachs) nutrition and soon became a valued research assistant in the ruminant nutrition laboratory working with Ph.D. and master's students. Kiana also conducted her own research, evaluating in-vitro ruminal degradation of red

chile byproducts compared to alfalfa hay and presenting this research at several symposiums, including one in Puerto Rico before USDA and industry leaders.

Throughout her senior year, Kiana mentored other students as an undergraduate teaching assistant. She spent summer 2024 as a USDA research intern at the C. Oran Little Research Center at the University of Kentucky, working alongside students and professionals, completing research certifications, and helping train other students.
